



## Pelindo Group Improves Access to Education for Kaluku Bodoa Community

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MAKASSAR, May 29, 2024 - PT Pelabuhan Indonesia (Persero) Group in the Makassar working area implemented the Social and Environmental Responsibility (TJSL) program by holding a "Learning House" activity in Kaluku Bodoa Village, Makassar City.

Pelindo Regional 4 Executive Director Abdul Azis said that the overall goal of the Corporate Social and Environmental Responsibility program is to improve the standard of living of the community, especially in the Pelindo work environment area.

It is known that Pelindo's TJSL focuses on three areas, namely Education, Environment, and Development of MSMEs or Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises.
